#### **Anthroposophic Nursing**

All nurses working with anthroposophic medicine are qualified nurses with state registration. We use massage, herbal teas and decoctions for compresses, inhalations and healing plant oils in oil dispersion bath apparatus. We use a wide range of plants for example ginger, mustard, lemon and lavender in various forms. The anthroposophic nurse's repertoire of treatments is large and includes foot baths, organ compresses and specific organ massages or the rhythmical body oiling.

Rhythmic Massage Based on the Anthroposophic understanding of the human being, the aim of Hauschka rhythmical massage is to re-establish the harmonisation if the ego, astral. etheric and physical bodies. With rhythmical movements and specific forms that engage the patient's own healing forces, rhythmical massage strengthens the middle rhythmic system, countering imbalances in the strength of intellect or the will, the metabolic limb system thereby reconnecting the individual to the greater rhythms necessary for life. The massage movements stimulate life giving forces and when specifically directed, can support weakened organs.

Hauschka Art Therapy consciously arouses active processes of perception, feeling and will in the individual by means of the specific content of the artistic set task. Many imbalances within the complex human organisation become manifest and through strengthening the art work whether drawing, painting or clay modeling, the healing process is set in motion by the patient. The speedy breathlessness of modern life creates an inner restlessness and via conscious slow deliberate brushstrokes which work on the middle rhythmic system, an inner peace is stimulated in the painting work. Blockages are released and the soul is allowed to breathe afresh.
